Friends with the triune God

I no longer call you slaves, because a master doesn't confide in his slaves.

Now you are my friends, since I have told you everything the Father told

me. John 14:15

Aren't you glad to count on a friend that understands you? We have a friend named Jesus that sits next to our God and because this friend understands us, we can be confident that he pleads for us when we make mistakes. The author of the book of Hebrews wrote:

"So then, since we have a great High Priest (friend) who has entered heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to what we believe. ¹⁵ This High Priest of ours understands our weaknesses, for he faced all of the same testings we do, yet he did not sin. ¹⁶ So let us come boldly to the throne of our gracious God. There we will receive his mercy, and we will find grace to help us when we need it most"

Hebrews 4:14-16

When we understand our relationship with God as a friendship and see ourselves as friends of God, our prayers will be different. We will see our prayer being led by the Holy Spirit and our relationship with God will be stronger. The church I grew up in taught me a lot of misunderstanding about God.
