

Matthew 22:36-37

"Teacher, which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses?"

³⁷ Jesus replied, "'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' 38 This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself."

We all deal with relationships throughout our lives. Some are good; some others are not so good. The truth is that we care to establish good relationships with our spouses, kids, parents or even a friend but one relationship some people neglects to work on is the relationship with themselves.

Your Food Pantry makes a difference in the lives of many families. Recently when we were opening on a Wednesday, two women came to our pantry for the first time. Not unusual in itself, but their circumstances tell the story. Their husbands had lost their jobs two weeks before. The women had seen the sign about our pantry, but were embarrassed to ask for food. However, our gracious approach helped them to get food that helped feed their families in a time of crisis. Later that same day, an elderly man came in and asked about food. His daughter, her husband and two children had come to live with them because the husband had lost his job. The man and his wife were retired and eager to support their daughter and her family, but the sudden increase in expenses put a strain on their income from Social Security and pension. Your food pantry made a positive difference in all these lives. All these folks said "God bless you" as they received help. That blessing and gratitude goes to you as you have provided the support for this ministry.

Each month, the number of families we serve increases slightly. Some folks come for a while when they're struggling and then we never see them again. Other families are regular as they are on fixed incomes and have few resources. This month, there was a Vanguard Utility Locating Service car in the line for the pantry. We thought he was caught in the traffic, however, he was there because he was a graduate from the Spirit of Hope Men's Shelter at our church who had found a job and an apartment. He had used the pantry before while he was homeless. His new apartment was missing several light bulbs and he remembered that the pantry gave out light bulbs.
