Love Languages- "Acts of Service"

By acts of service, we mean doing things you know your spouse would like you to do. You seek to please your spouse by serving him/her, to express your love for by doing things for him/her.

We often think that because those little things your spouse does every day are normal, they are not an act of service. We tend not to appreciate what he or she does every day.

Consider actions such as cooking a meal, setting a table, emptying the dishwasher, vacuuming, changing the baby's diaper, picking up a prescription, keeping the car in operating condition, taking out the garbage, doing the laundry as well as many other things we do on a daily basis. Believe it or not they are all acts of service. They require thought, planning, time, effort and energy. If done with a positive spirit, they are indeed expressions of love.

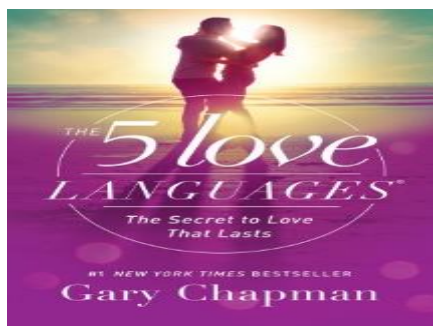
Every day we do things for each other; find out if the acts of service are one of your spouse's love language, but even if it is not, let's appreciate each other for every act of service each other does.

A willingness to examine and change stereotypes is necessary in order to express love more effectively. Remember, there are no rewards for maintaining stereotypes, but there are tremendous benefits to meeting the emotional needs of your spouse. If your spouse's love language is acts of service, then "actions speak louder than words." (con't on pg. 5)
