

I Am Able

Ephesians 3:20

"Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think."

There are many things in life that we are able to do, but there are things that we try to do and realize after many tries that we are not able. That is when God says "I am able." You may think that you can do everything with your own strength, but when you have tried and tried and get tired of trying, then most likely you would give up. That's what people do when they have tried for so long and fail. Some people do not really understand the power that is in them thru God. Because there is not an intimate relationship with him, it is easy to fall into the mentality of the impossible. For God, impossible is nothing. When we get to know God intimately we will understand that God is able to do great things.

The word "to be able" used in all of the following scriptures comes from the Greek word "Dunamai" and it means essentially "to have all the power" When we say that God is able to do something it means He has "all the power" to do it. It is a concept related to His omnipotence. Let's look at a few of the specific things the Bible says He is able to do.

He Is Able to Save Us Completely. "Therefore, He is able, once and forever, to save those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them" (Hebrews 7:25 NLT)

He Is Able to Keep Us from Sin. "Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy" (Jude 24).

This difference is striking and important is that Jesus is concerned for all persons; Jews and Gentiles. Equally important is the major role disciples played in feeding these groups. Thus, as modern-day disciples of Jesus, we play an important role in showing love, understanding, acceptance, and care for all those who come to the food pantry seeking food. While our numbers are not as striking as 4,000 or 5,000, they are significant, and the mission we have in assisting those in need to be properly fed is just as important. Your support of the pantry is a modern-day miracle of feeding all persons who come to the pantry who are hungry and without enough food. Thank you for being a modern-day disciple who follows the example of Jesus and the disciples in feeding all who have gathered.

During the month of March, your pantry has had the privilege of providing generous sized hams to 28 families so that they could have a special Easter dinner. We continue to serve at least 30 families each week, with the largest number in March being 40 families on 3/27/24. The number of families served increases as we come to the end of each month.

Thank you for your continued compassion and help for those hungry families in our community. Together we are God's hands reaching out and touching hungry persons in our community.

The Bible Study group has been studying Matthew's Gospel in the past several weeks. In the chapters studied so far, there

are two stories of Jesus' miraculously feeding first 5,000 and then 4,000 men plus the attendant number of women and children. The disciples play an important role in helping to feed these thousands of people. One major difference in these two stories is the nature of the people who are fed.
