# Pastor Angel's Page

#### The three amigos

Six days later Jesus took Peter and the two brothers, James and John, and led them up a high mountain to be alone. Matthew 17: 1

A British publication once offered a prize for the best definition of a friend. Among the thousands of answers received were the following: "One, who multiplies joys, divides grief and whose honesty is inviolable." "One who understands our silence." "A volume of sympathy bound in cloth." "A watch that beats true for all time and never runs down." The winning definition read: "A friend is the one who comes in when the whole world has gone out."

I think the best definition of a friend is the name of Jesus. He said there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. Jesus gave his life to save us all and it came with a great cost. We all have friends, some are closer than others. It is important to have a friend in which we can trust with our own personal problems.

Jesus did have twelve friends that he called his disciples in whom He strategically invested time and effort. Out of the twelve, He chose three amigos that He took to a different level than the other nine. Peter, James and John are considered Jesus' inner circle of the original twelve disciples.

If it was important to Jesus, the Son of God, to have an inner circle of friends like Peter, John and James, it must be because God knew we couldn't do life by ourselves. We are all called to be disciples of Jesus, regardless of our past, present or future circumstances.

The Outreach Committee has been participating in this ecumenical mission project (which provides food for the weekend to school children in need) with other area churches for 2 years. In addition to helping pack food bags, each church strives to make money donations to help cover costs for the food. After last month's lengthy article, March's article will be much shorter. Our customers remain steady at about 32 families per week. However, February 19<sup>th</sup>, when the temperatures and wind chill

factor was subzero, we served 35 families. In January, when we had our last significant snowstorm, we had only 11 customers. It seems that cold is not such a deterrent as snow is for our customers. Regardless of the number of families served each week, all are extremely grateful for the food provided and the overwhelming majority say "God bless you."

As you are aware, Feeding America is one of our partners as a source of food for the pantry. This month we received a letter from them indicating how much food we obtained from them in the past year. In 2025, we received enough food for 11,674 meals. We received food for 8,421 meals at no cost, while we paid for 3,253 meals. The percentage amounts for these two numbers are 72% and 28%, respectively.

Here's the general distribution of resources in broad categories:

•	Bakery	27 pounds
•	Dairy	6o6 pounds
•	Protein	2 <b>,</b> 560 pounds
•	Produce	445 pounds
•	Dry/Shelf Stable	7,771 pounds

That's a great partnership; and it is similar to the image of donations we received from individuals, churches, and organizations in the greater Delavan area. To be successful in fighting hunger in the Delavan community, we need broad support and diverse resources.

#### The Lenten desert

During the Lenten season, which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5 this year), Christians figuratively follow Jesus into the desert. Just as our Savior spent 40 days fasting and facing temptation, we focus on self-reflection and contrition.

In an 1873 hymn, Claudia Hernaman wrote, "O Lord, throughout these forty

days, you prayed and kept the fast. Inspire repentance for our sin, and free us from our past."

The desert experience of Lent serves a clear purpose, filling us up rather than depleting us. "This is what Lent is meant to be," writes theologian Ron Rolheiser. "Time in the desert to courageously face the chaos and the demons within us and to let God do battle with them through us. The result is that we are purified, made ready, so the intoxicating joy of Easter might then bind us more closely to God and each other."



We have more than enough food containers, so if you have more that you were thinking about donating, <u>please</u> recycle them.
