Pastor Angel's Page

Is God in Control?

"You can make many plans, but the Lord's purpose will prevail." Proverbs 19: 21

Being in control means that things are going to be the way we like it and it also means that we will feel safe, accomplished and good about ourselves. Sometimes it could also be very tiring. Trying to keep control of your life, your finances, your marriage, your kids' education, your career and so on, could be quite a bit of work.

What if trying to control these things keeps you away from God? Have you been fighting to get control of something and still feel like it is falling out of your hands? What if it's not God's will? You may be fighting against God.

What happens when our plans don't align with God's plans? Perhaps you've had an experience where a plan you longed to accomplish fell apart. If it did, then let it go. The moment our plans don't align with God's plan that is when we are trying to take control and not allowing God to take control.

If it's not God's will, no matter how much you try, it is not going to happen. YOU HAVE TO LET IT GO. One thing I know really well is that God's plans are better than mine. No matter how good my plans can be, God's plans are always better, so when things don't go the way I want them to, I let it go off my hands. I give them all to God in prayer and say, "Your will be done."

Allow God to take control and you will experience the perfect will of God in your life. Remember: "You may have a good plan, but God's purpose is better."

FOOD PANTRY (con't)

Barb showed her that we had been open for 120 minutes at that moment and that we were filling order 26 as they spoke. Doing the math, on average, it required 4.6 minutes to process an order. This took the wind out of the visitors' sails, saying that she guessed it was not as inefficient as she thought.

Barb also told her that when there was someone who had an appointment, we shuffled cars to get that person served quickly so they could get to work. We also have dealt with dead batteries and cars that would not start, so we were experienced in how to manage developing problems.

There is an old hymn written by William Cowper in 1774, entitled "God Moves in a Mysterious Way His Wonders to Perform." The simple math calculation helped our visitor to reframe her perspective and judgment. It helped me to let go of my anger and defensiveness of the pantry work and volunteers. God is present in each situation and the opportunity for ministry is not always in the main task, but in each encounter that surrounds the main task/goal.

By the way, we served a total of 42 families that day. It was not the highest, but it was 10 families over our average (or 1/3 more than average). We are grateful for this ministry to the hungry in our area and we are thankful for each and every donation of food, finances, or time that allows the pantry to function. God bless you for your part in this vital ministry.

Wednesday, Aug. 20 was an especially busy day at the pantry. When we arrived to prepare for the day there were 3 walk-up visitors and 8 cars in line waiting for us to open. By the time we opened, there were 12 cars in line with the line growing by the minute. It was my week to work and I and another volunteer were filling orders, while the two younger volunteers were taking orders to our visitors and loading them in the cars. They were also restocking shelves and the "Free Choice Table" with additional items and produce. It was an unusually busy start for our pantry. We were "in the groove" swiftly filling orders and had at least 2 orders filled and waiting for each visitor when they came in to make their selection from the Free Choice Table.

At close to 11:00, a visitor stormed into the pantry, complaining that she had to wait 20 minutes before she got her order, saying, "When I have to wait 20 minutes for free food, it's no longer free!" She was loud enough that we heard her in the pantry as we were working to fill orders. She said she wanted to come to the meeting of the pantry and register her complaint about how poorly the pantry was operated. As the coordinator, I work one Wednesday each month, but I drop by often on other weeks to bring additional produce or to just support our volunteers and greet our visitors. I knew from my actual work and seeing other volunteers working that no one was slacking off, but that they took pride in filling orders quickly and accurately. I was about to step out and share my frustration with her anger and judgment on our process.

However, my wife Barb was distributing and collecting shopping lists from guests and said she would deal with this visitor so we could continue to fill orders. I stepped back into the room and continued to fill orders while she spoke with the woman.
